Walking in Unity and Maturity

1. Read together

Ephesians 4:1-16

2. Questions:

1. What was the most impactful, encouraging, challenging or confusing from this text and sermon?
2. What does it mean that Christians are called to “become who you are?” How should that help us understand commands and directives in Scripture? How can we help one another do that as we read the second half of Ephesians?
3. Where do Christians already have unity? Where do we not have unity? Practically, how can we strive to both maintain and attain unity?
4. Paul calls pastors to equip all Christians so that all Christians do “the work of ministry.” How is that different from the way the church often operates in our culture? What are some specific ways you can do “the work of ministry” in your life? What kind of equipping do you need to do that?
5. One mark of Christian maturity is being anchored. What does that mean and look like in your life?
6. Another mark of Christian maturity is speaking the truth in love. If you’re willing, share an instance in your life right now where you’re wrestling with how to speak the truth in love to another person. What would speaking the truth in love look like in this real life situation?
