# **Foundations of Christian Story**

I] Description of Class and Class Objectives: Humans are narrative creatures. We tell stories to make us laugh or cry; to make us scared or nostalgic. More than that, we all make sense of our lives, human history, and society by fitting them into a story. This class will be an eight-week introduction to the Christian story of the universe. Students will engage with what the Bible says the true story of the world is and will interact with their role in this massive story of creation, fall, redemption, and glorification.

# **Objectives:**

- A. After completing this class, the students will be able to:
  - a. Tell the story of human history as creation, fall, redemption, and glorification
  - b. Articulate their own role in the greatest story ever told
  - c. Apply the hermeneutical method of Jesus and His apostles

### **III**] Class Structure:

- A. The class will consist of three elements:
  - a. Assigned weekly reading
  - b. Group discussion (during our weekly meeting)
  - c. Teaching time (during our weekly meeting)
- B. The content of the discussion and teaching will be based on the understanding that you have read the weekly assignments prior to attending class. Use the Class Schedule to be prepared for the upcoming classes.
